In recent years, a considerable number of countries have developed and implemented strategies aiming at reducing inequalities in health. However, knowledge of effective policies or strategies to reduce socioeconomic inequalities in health is still very fragmented. The aim of this book is to describe and compare different European health equity strategies and their potential successes.

The main part of the material comes from a comparative study of national public health strategies for equity in health with the following participating countries: Denmark, Finland, England, Italy, Netherlands, Norway, Spain and Sweden. National experts wrote the country chapters which not only cover questions concerning whether their countries were taking measures on the individual public health problems – such as smoking, alcohol or physical activity – but also if the policies had considered the wider, social determinants of health and experiences of the potential implementation processes.

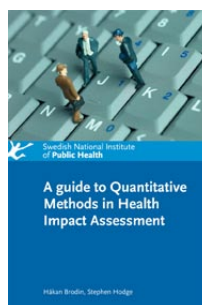


### Alcohol Statistics 2007

The purpose of the Alcohol Statistics report is to provide an accurate picture of the scope and development of the alcohol market in Sweden over time. The statistics also provide a basis for control, evaluation and monitoring in the alcohol sector.

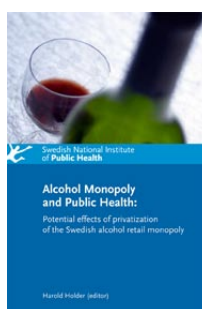


### A guide to Quantitative Methods in Health Impact Assessment

The Swedish government has given the Swedish National Institute of Public Health (SNIPH) the task of both developing methods in Health Impact Assessment (HIA) and supporting the application of HIA at central, regional and local levels. These reports mainly use qualitative methods, which in most cases are sufficient for an HIA. Some cases however, require the use of quantitative methods because of their complex nature. As a complement to existing qualitative reports, SNIPH offers this guide to quantitative analysis and methods in HIA.

This guide is written for people who work with practical analysis in the public health field at local, regional and central levels. It is also useful for decision-makers who may require a Health Impact Assessment to inform and support important decisions in a range of areas both inside and outside public health.



### Alcohol Monopoly and Public Health

This report presents a study carried out by a team of Swedish and international alcohol researchers who have examined the consequences of eliminating the monopoly system. The report analyses how alcohol consumption and alcohol-related harm would change if the monopoly system were eliminated and alcohol sales moved to licensed liquor stores or grocery stores.

The authors conclude that eliminating the retail monopoly would likely lead to a considerable increase in alcohol consumption. As a result, an increase would likely also be seen in deaths, diseases, and injuries and harm associated with the rise in alcohol consumption. Those most affected by such a change would be young people and heavy drinkers.
